


MUSIC / TECHNO



my workflow consisted out of various tools. First, I prompted ChatGPT or Adobe Firefly with a picture I wanted to create. To optimize the process, I gave the models inspiration picture for reference. Once the pictures were generated used photo editing apps like lightroom and photoshop depending on the manipulation I wanted to do. With runway I animated the pictures. I used Touch designer for a few subtle effects on the videos and PremierPro as my editing software for the final video.

DALLE workflow

PROMPT: "create a picture inspired by this picture, black and white, lights in some apartments while others are dark, the shot is from far away and should have a moody lighting"




On most of the picture generations I worked with Adobe Firefly, this is the only picture I used from ChatGPT in my final video, but I still wanted to explain the workflow. I prompted ChatGPT with the prompt you see above and included a picture of a brutalist architecture high-rise as a reference. The prompt tells ChatGPT to take the picture as a reference and create a completely new picture based on it. The result I am very happy with. It ended up being the starting picture of my Video.

ADOBE FIREFLY

The Adobe Firefly workflow was very similar I gave Adobe Firefly inspiration pictures for reference and prompted it with the visuals I wanted to be created, Firefly also allows to customize your output to parameters like photo, low lighting, black and white. I made use of them to create a cohesive theme and tried not to change the prompt too much to create similar themed pictures.




A large corpus of the final generated pictures:



STORYBOARD

The idea in my video was to go from far away closer and closer into the privacy of the "actors" in the video. It starts with the building block and zooms into the rooms and changes scenes. Then it gets closer and closer highlighting the people dancing and getting lost in time.



DISCUSSION

In the creation process I faces some issues the biggest issue for me was coming up with a cohesive theme which would guide the viewer through the whole video. In the beginning I tried to find inspiration from Pinterest which turned out to be quite hard. My biggest learning in this course is how to find inspiration and create a process in which I use inspiration in a useful manner to create a theme / topic for a video. In the process I also tried different tools like stable diffusion and other text-to-video transformers, for me Runway worked the best because of its ease to use and the premium version which we got. Stable diffusion does have a lot of potential, but a lot of computational power and knowhow is needed to create anything meaningful. In conclusion I am happy with my result and how the story leaves room for interpretation. In addition, the music feels to fit well to the visuals which makes it more immersive. My experimentation with adding a German voice to the video also made it more personal.
